Resources teach about life in the womb October 27, 2023 / Reporter / By Caitlin Magness



New and updated resources from LCMS Life Ministry are designed to teach youth about the life of a child in the womb. The resources, under the title "Looking at Life in the Womb," emphasize prenatal development, the sanctity of human life, and God's perfect design and loving care for each person. Through age-appropriate content and activities for early childhood, elementary school students and teenagers, the resources explore God's development of a child in the womb from conception to birth. Scripture passages encourage students to consider unborn children in light of God's Word, with each person being "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:14).

"We want to stress the flexibility of the resources, which can be used in LCMS classrooms and also in the home and in Sunday school," said Deaconess Dr. Tiffany Manor, managing director of Human Care and Ministerial Support for the LCMS Office of National Mission (ONM). "There is a curriculum with lessons for schools and also activities and videos. People can pick and choose whatever works for them. We are going to continue to add to this set to offer Christ-centered resources." (In the elementary curriculum, Scripture passages and reflections are included in their own section so that the curriculum may be also adapted for use in secular schools.)

The curriculum (which has two versions, one for teenagers and one for elementary-aged children) is divided into modules according to topic. Each module includes:

- A basic lesson;
- A PowerPoint presentation;
- A teacher's guide;
- Vocabulary terms;
- Discussion questions;
- Further exploration and readings on the module's topic (for teens); and
- Scriptural application.

The resource for early childhood (3–5 years old) consists of activity mats, drawing pages and a poster. The early childhood resource does not cover the issue of abortion like the main curriculum but does present information on development in the womb as well as reflections on Scripture for young children, affirming their inherent worth as beloved children of God.

Stephanie Neugebauer, a registered diagnostic medical sonographer and manager of Health Ministry for the ONM, has been involved with creating the set of resources since its inception. She cites her firsthand experience working in pregnancy resource centers with abortion-vulnerable and abortion-minded women as part of the inspiration for the project.

"It's hard to put into words the change that happened on the exam table as I performed an ultrasound — most women, who before had considered abortion a mere medical solution to a biological problem, saw the very humanness of their unborn children, and suddenly abortion became an unthinkable solution to a very human circumstance," she said.

"I'm seeing these [women and girls] come in, as young as 14 and as old as 45, many not understanding how their bodies work, how human gestation and development work. The thought occurred to me: How can we teach people (both young men and young women) about life in the womb so that they get a chance to see what I get to witness every day? ... What if we equipped them earlier with this information and experience, so that hopefully their eyes are opened to the human living in the womb?"

The new resources were created with funding provided by a grant from the Lutheran Women's Missionary League and reflect the Synod's ongoing commitment to uphold the sanctity of life. In July 2023, the Synod in convention adopted Resolution 3-01, "To Encourage and Support More Fervent Teaching, Proclamation, and Efforts to Promote Culture of Life among God's People." The "Looking at Life in the Womb" resources continue the work of LCMS Life Ministry to support congregations, districts and Recognized Service Organizations who are seeking to build a culture of life in the LCMS and beyond.

Sermon by Martin Luther December 25th, 1522



CHRISTMAS DAY

And the Word became flesh.

(John 1:14)

Christ has a holy birth, immaculate and pure. Our birth is sinful and accursed, and we can only be helped through the holy birth of Christ. Yet Christ's birth cannot be shared with us, but it is offered spiritually to everyone wherever the Word is preached. Those who firmly believe and receive it will not suffer harm because of their own sinful birth.

It was Christ's will and pleasure to be born as a man so that in him we might be born again. "In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures" (James 1:18). In this way Christ takes our birth away from us and immerses it in his own birth, giving us his birth, that we may be made new and clean, as if it were our own birth. Therefore shall every Christian rejoice in this birth of Christ, and glory in it, as if they too were born of Mary. The one who does not believe that, or doubts it, is no Christian.

This is the great joy of which the angel speaks. This is God's comfort and his surpassing goodness, that we (if we believe) may glory in such a treasure, that Mary be our very mother, Christ our brother, and God our father. For all these things have truly happened that we might believe in them.

See, then, that you make this birth your own, exchanging with him, so that you might be rid of your birth, and might take on his, which happens when you believe. Then you surely will rest in the virgin Mary's lap as her darling child. But you must learn to have such faith and to exercise it throughout your earthly life, for it can never be strong enough.



Bemidji Circuit Convocation held October 28th at Trinity

Saturday October 28th Trinity hosted the Bemidji Circuit Convocation with over 75 members of the circuit's 8 congregations attending. 23 attendees were from Trinity in Bemidji. The Bemidji circuit is comprised of congregations located in the communities of Bagley, Blackduck, Cass Lake, Lake George, Bemidji, International Falls, Baudette, and Warroad. Of these congregations there are two full time called pastors and one part-time called pastor.

The goal of this convocation was to meet in worship, to study, and to discuss together our mutual needs and find the opportunities and options the Lord has for providing Pastoral care to the circuit.

After opening prayer and devotion, LCMS North District President Pastor Finnern spoke to the group on the challenges, and hope, that we currently all share. Struggles are not just confined to our region, but across our nation. Today in the LCMS, there are

over 571 congregations actively calling pastors (there are 5800 churches in the LCMS). The MN North District has 36 vacant congregations. While his message was to the point; he shared that whatever the obstacles, God has a path, even in challenging times. God's church will not disappear – it will continue to thrive.

Pastor Moeller of Warroad shared a study on 1Corinthians 12 – In Christ: One body with many members.

Pastor Domke presented on the Church and its Ministry with continual focus on history and biblical truth that we can stand upon.

Pastor Wentzel (Bemidji Circuit Visitor) gave a power point presentation providing some options for our circuit on how to minister to our congregations. Topics included outreach via technology, multi-parish pastors, lay ministry, utilizing a hub concept, and the possible 'blessed end' of congregations. It was agreed that the circuit congregations should continue to work together discussing options and being open to all possibilities.

Elder and leader training was tentatively set for January 20, 2024.


"Northwood's Pregnancy Center Toy Drive"

The Design Store will be here the week of December 18-22 to install the new flooring. The preschool and childcare classes will be held upstairs in the fellowship hall that week.




What you need:

 Use magnet tiles to build designs atop the light box.



DECEMBER STEWARDSHIP

The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?


Advent comes from a Latin word that means "coming" and its emphasis is preparation for the coming of Christ. The blue paraments
