December 'Witness': The gift of children

In Psalm 127, Solomon declares: "Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward" (Psalm 127:3).

Why are children so important? Why has God given them as a reward, an ongoing heritage from God?

There's no better time than Christmas to ponder this question. For the birth of Christ makes the birth of every child a blessing and a gift. The One through whom creation came into existence took on human flesh in the womb of His mother, the Virgin Mary.

And in her flesh, He grew. God — in the womb of a woman. What a mystery worthy of marveling. What a gift beyond our comprehension, the gift that confounds our every attempt to understand.

In that gift, Christ makes all births a miracle worthy of our marvel. It is no wonder the devil, the world and our sinful flesh have declared war on children; it's no wonder that they have launched a full assault on the gift of life. For, as the Rev. Jeffrey Hemmer writes in the December issue of The Lutheran Witness (LW), "No one hates children more than [Satan] does."

The December issue of LW takes up the blessing of children — both how they bless us and how we might bless them. For example, the Rev. Christopher Nuttelman discusses how parents and other family members can bless children in the home, providing both a biblical foundation and guidance on doing so.

The issue contains much more: reflections on becoming like a little child by Sarah Reinsel and Josh Pauling's thoughts on how Christ's birth subverts the spirit of our age.

Every child is a blessing from God. Period. No asterisks, footnotes or addendum. Christ makes all children gifts, good and gracious blessings of God.

"Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them!" (Psalm 127:4-5).

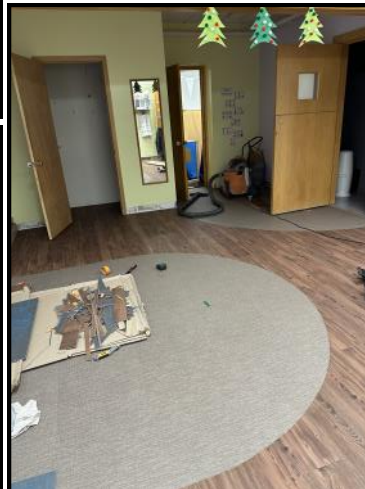
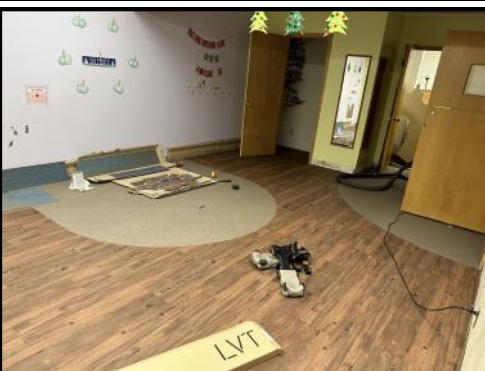



NEW FLOORING UPDATE

The new flooring has been installed! What a great new look for our Center!

New INSIDE



Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



What you do:

1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.

JANUARY STEWARDSHIP

The Chief Stewards of Humanity: Mom and Dad

St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the first commandment with a specific promise attached to it is, “Honor your father and mother so that it may go well with you, and you may live long in the land” (Eph. 6:2). This promise is one indication of the importance of this commandment. The other thing that highlights the special nature of this commandment is its placement within the Ten Commandments.

The Ten Commandments are clearly organized in two big categories. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. This category is called the First Table of the Law. The last seven commandments, the Second Table of the Law, tell us how we should relate to other people. These two tables correspond to what Jesus calls the two greatest commandments: “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind,” and “You shall love your neighbor as yourself” (Matt. 22:37–39).

The order of the Second Table of the Law is also important. Murder is a greater sin than adultery, which is a greater sin than stealing, or lying, or coveting. But why is the Fourth Commandment first in the Second Table, ahead of “you shall not murder”? Is disobeying your parents really worse than murder? Or maybe we should give up on thinking these commandments are ordered?

The overall effect of this order is to get us to see our parents as a connection point between our neighbors and our God. Throughout our upbringing our father and mother stand between us and God and deliver His gifts to us: God clothes us, feeds us, protects us and teaches His Word to us through our parents.

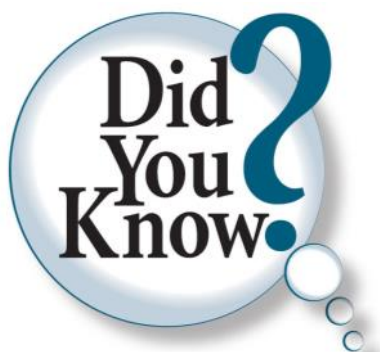
So, parents have a very high calling from God. They are called to be stewards of the greatest gift: the gift of life.

Parenting thus gives us a keen insight into all our stewardship. Parents know that they have been given a great treasure in their children, a treasure that does not belong to them, yet for which they feel a great deal of responsibility. Truth be told, every gift we have been given is like this, because everything we have — whether our own personal skills and powers or our wealth and time — is all from God. He entrusts it all to us so that we can use it all and take care of it all for His great purposes.

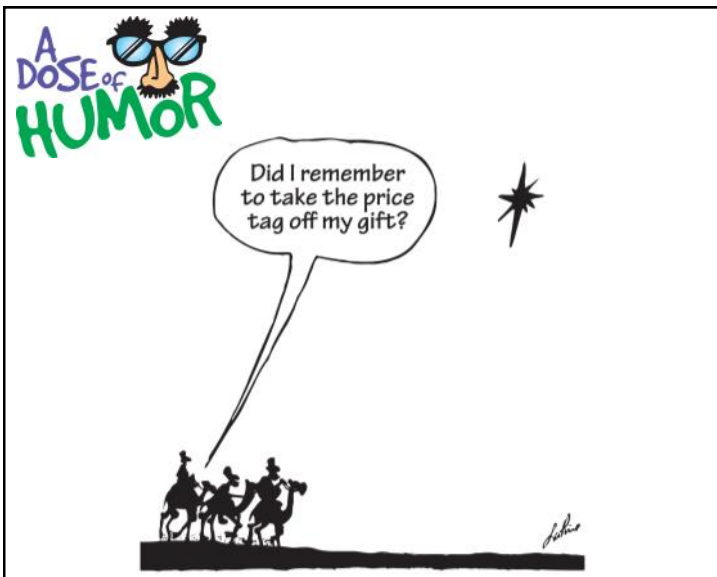
