Intentionality: In church work formation, a little word with an eternal impact

In his breviary, Martin Luther wrote a short meditation for each day of the year. For March 11, he wrote, "We could still bear it if need demanded that someone should steal all our worldly goods, our honor and our lives or whatever else we may have. It would, however, be too much if we let someone steal our wonderful consoling Gospel, our faith and Christ Himself. That would be simply too much."

Luther's words are deeply meaningful to us. This is our prayer for our children and grandchildren; for our family and friends; for our neighbor, ourselves and all God's people. We pray fervently that no one steal from any of us the wonderful consoling Gospel, saving faith and Christ Himself, who provides what is most needful throughout all the stages, challenges, sufferings and joys of life.

As Jesus taught us, we pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest (Matt. 9:38). These words are meaningful to you as you pray that God would supply your congregation with an excellent pastor to feed you with God's Word. These words are meaningful to you as you pray for an excellent teacher in your Lutheran school to instruct your children with the Word of God and a virtuous education. Some of you are praying for a deaconess, a director of Christian education, a director of parish music or another servant for your congregation.

We have learned from our research that nearly 90% of Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) pastors and commissioned church workers, and nearly 60% of LCMS parents and congregational leaders, have heard about Set Apart to Serve (SAS). Through all of us, God is building a wonderful culture among us — a culture of forming and recruiting full-time workers in our LCMS congregations, schools, districts and entities.

To grow this culture — so that church work formation and recruitment become knit into the very fabric of our congregations and schools — there is a very important word I want to share with you: intentional.

Resources available

SAS has many resources and best practices to help us all be intentional about forming, recruiting and encouraging youth and adults in our congregation to consider full-time church work. This includes the free SAS curriculum at cph.org/sas.

There is no easy path to creating a culture in which church work formation and recruitment are knit into the fabric of our congregations, schools and districts. However, as we are all fervently praying for excellent church workers, we have many resources available to help.

The resources are organized according to those who are most influential in forming and recruiting youth and adults to consider full-time church work. Select the tab that pertains most to you — pastors, parents, church workers (commissioned), laity or districts. Click on a resource that piques your interest. How does it apply to you? How can this resource be used in your congregation or school? Whom are you encouraging to consider being a full-time church worker?

All of us have a vested interest in having pastors who feed us with God's Word and Sacraments for eternal life. Many of us also have a deep interest in having Lutheran school teachers for our children, directors of Christian education, deaconesses, directors of parish music and others to teach God's Word and especially to help us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our saving faith (Heb. 12:2).

As we pray to the Lord of the harvest, may we also intentionally work to encourage those in our midst to become laborers in that harvest, that His loving purposes may be fulfilled.

5. Sign your names and the date at the bottom.



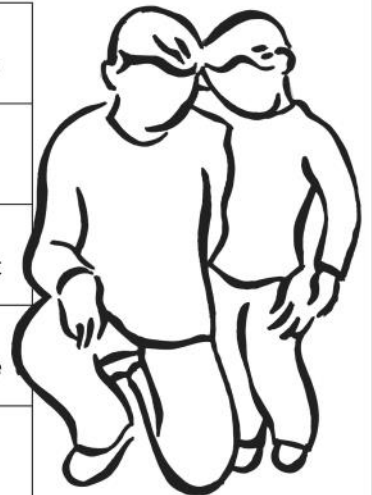

Law & Gospel

Have you ever thought of the two biblical topics of “Law and Gospel” as being inseparable according to God’s word, or do you believe that God’s law much be separated from the Gospel when Jesus speaks about His grace and our salvation?

Of course, we prefer to hear the joyful Gospel message that all is forgiven, but shy away from addressing the reality that exists under the law that men who reject Christ are condemned. The law’s ability to condemn is a topic we just don’t want to hear about, especially in our society that says breaking many of God’s laws is the acceptable thing to do.

In fact, to speak of the law alongside the Gospel is often considered taboo even when Christ so faithfully preached both from His Word.

So I raise the question, why did Christ preach law and gospel so faithfully? And the answer lies in the truth that without our sins being exposed by the law, we would have no way or for that matter any reason to see our need for the Gospel through which we are saved. This is why I appreciate Jesus’ parable of the marriage feast from Matthew 22 because in it he so wonderfully teaches both.

First, when Jesus teaches the Gospel by using the example of a king who invites all to join him at the wedding feast of his son. And second, as he reveals the result of denying the king’s invitation, which meant condemnation for all who did.

So let’s take a brief look at what Jesus says concerning “law and gospel” in the opening verse of the parable: “The kingdom of heaven is like a king who made a marriage for his son, and sent forth his servants to call them that were bidden to the wedding; and they would not come.” (Matt. 22:2 KJV)

Right off, Jesus reminds us that our heavenly Father, the King, calls us to join him in honoring Jesus as our Savior. This has always been God’s invitation from the moment He said to Adam and Eve that He would send a Savior to crush Satan’s head, although for a moment Satan would bruise Jesus ‘ heal as he hung on the cross to shed his blood that cleanses us from our sin.

Jesus plainly is inviting us throughout he Gospel in this parable to be part of his great wedding feast where we receive his mercy and grace. Indeed, he never stops calling us to join him at his banquet of grace. However, while the message of grace is so prominent, Jesu also makes this comment; “And they would not come.”

Sadly it’s true; many have not come because they deny that Jesus is their only hope for salvation despite the fact Good sets before us a table fit for kings.

So why refuse such a gracious invitation from God to sit next to his most honored son Jesu who died on the cross to save us? The parable tells us, many were too busy to say “yes” to the king. Many thought themselves to be too righteous and without sin, too good to be seated with the king. Some even hated the king’s messengers so much that they killed them. So how did the king respond? “When the king heard of it, he was angry; and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city.” (Matt 22:7 KJV)

Do you find it amazing that Jesus would present a parable where he speaks both of his grace and of his condemnation against those who reject him? Do you find it startling how many reject his invitation to join him in eternity because they believe they are without sin or are too busy to give honor and glory to him?

We should not be surprised, because this is true; Jesus clearly teaches both law and gospel as being necessary for us to recognize that we are sinful beings whose great and eternal loss is to reject his invitation to join him in his kingdom.

So if we look closely at scripture, we will always find that Jesus teaches both law and gospel. For, we learn that the king kept sending out the same message to which many answered “Yes.”

So I pray you will hear our heavenly Father’s invitation to live by faith in Jesus so that you too may sit with him in glory forever in his kingdom which has not end.

JUNE STEWARDSHIP

Rooted in Christ, Growing in Stewardship

The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life!

Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor.

To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymn!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, May we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

- The tree of faith is not planted in us by us. It is the Spirit's work! We do not claim the title "steward." Rather, we are created for it (Gen. 1:26-28).
- He is the One who makes it grow in us. The fruits of the Spirit are borne out because we, by grace through faith, are connected to the vine that is Jesus (John 15).

Laden branches freely bearing Gifts the Giver loves to bless; Here is fruit that grows by sharing, Patience, kindness, gentleness.

- Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.
- But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, Teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

- Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.
- This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

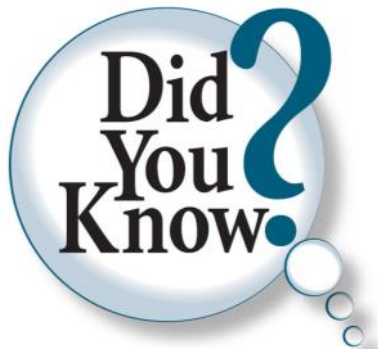
Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, May we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

- Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.
- The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!
